


February Health Office Updates



- School Physical Exams are scheduled for Tuesday, April 16th at Lakeshore Road. Several documents have been sent home, requesting missing physical exams. If you previously received a physical request and have not submitted documentation or an appointment date, your child is scheduled to receive a School Physical Exam with our district provider.
- Our winter weather and playground terrain is unpredictable.
