


We have made it past 100 days of school and will be in the home stretch.

This month we will be discussing Self- Awareness and students will have the opportunity to earn this paw. Talk with your child(ren) at home about how you practice self- awareness and what it looks like.

- A healthy sense of identity
- Self-reflection
- Understanding thoughts & feelings
- Self-respect
- Sense of purpose
- 1. You can practice and demonstrate self-awareness by asking open-ended questions to show interest in what they think. Ex: If you could change one thing about how your day went, what would it be?
- 2. Using I statements to say what you are feeling and why. Ex: I felt frustrated because I was having a hard time focusing on the work I needed to complete.
- 3. Ask them to share their opinions on things. Ex: What is your favorite special area class or subject?

- 4. Set aside time for them to reflect on learning. Ex: What was it like to work in a group and what is something you could next time you work with a group?
- 5. Highlight their contributions. Ex: I noticed you took care of your dinner plate without anyone asking. I appreciate you helping out around the house.

Think Spring and happy thoughts! On another note it gets very muddy outside, please consider sending in extra pants/clothes.

Kindergarten Registration is a great time to drop off your incoming student's required documents to the Health Office. This includes a recent physical exam, current immunization records and the parent completed Health History and Food Allergy Forms. If your child's immunizations are not up to date, please make arrangements to complete the required series before the start of school.

School physical exams are scheduled for Tuesday, April 16th. School physical exams are performed by a Board Certified Provider and are free of charge. You will soon receive notification if your child is scheduled for a school physical exam.
