North Syracuse Central School District Parents and Guardians,

The North Syracuse Central School District is partnering with Onondaga County to offer in-District vaccinations to eligible students. With vaccines now available to those age 12 or older, the County will hold an additional vaccination clinic in the NSCSD. The clinic for students and families to receive their FIRST dose vaccination will take place at Cicero-North Syracuse High School (6002 Route 31, Cicero, NY 13039) from 9 a.m. to 11:30 a.m. on **Tuesday, May 18**. Eligible students (age 12 +) and their family members from schools other than C-NS can participate in the clinic as long as they have the <u>printed and signed consent form</u>, provide their own transportation and stay with their child during vaccination. The necessary second dose clinic will take place at C-NS on June 8 for anyone participating in this clinic.

The County will also be administering second dose vaccinations to C-NS students who already received their first vaccination during the school's April 27 clinic. Second dose vaccinations will take place from 12:30 to 2:20 p.m. on Tuesday, May 18. Please note, it is necessary for all second dose participants to bring the printed and signed consent form.

If you are the parent/guardian of a child eligible to receive his/her FIRST dose vaccination, please <u>click here</u> to register your student. Be sure to select the clinic at C-NS on Tuesday, May 18.

- 1) To receive a vaccine, your child must bring their **printed, and signed consent form** along with proof of identification (driver's license or school ID) to their appointment. **Consent forms must be signed by a parent/guardian**. - 2) Individuals receiving the vaccine must also fill out the required New York State Department of Health Vaccine Form online at: http://forms.ny.gov/s3/vaccine.
- 3) Graduating seniors who complete their vaccination series at the June 8 second dose clinic will be considered fully vaccinated and will not have to be COVID tested prior to graduation.

Any family members that also would like to receive a vaccine can schedule an appointment using the same link. The same forms must also be completed for each individual and presented at the time of the appointment. Family members and remote students will need to arrive 5 minutes prior to their scheduled appointment time and enter the school at the main entrance.
