### **Concerned About Your Student's Performance?**

Counselors often receive calls and emails from parents who are concerned about their student's performance in their classes. We have developed the following plan for parents, and students, to utilize to improve their grades and work habits.

- 1. Have your son or daughter check their grades using the **online gradebook** through SchoolTool. Parents who provide the district with an email address can also access their children's grades through the **School Tool Parent Portal**. Please be sure that you have contacted Caron Lambert with an email address so she can assign a Parent Portal password for you to check your student's progress reports and report cards online. You may email her at clambert1@nscsd.org or contact her by phone at 315.218.4003.
- 2. **Progress reports** will be online this year and report cards will be mailed out every 10 weeks.
- 3. Have your son or daughter **make an appointment with their teacher(s) for extra help.** Teachers are generally available from 2:10 p.m. to 3:00 p.m. to provide extra help for students. Have your student touch base with their teachers ahead of time to set up a day and time to meet. Math Help is also available every block, and we have help available from 7:10 a.m. to 7:30 a.m. every morning.
- 4. **Contact your son or daughter's teacher directly**. You can call the school at 218-4100 and ask to have an email message sent to the teacher for you. You can use the staff directory on the district webpage to email the teacher directly.
- 5. If you have exhausted all of the above strategies, you may wish to **request a Parent/Teacher Conference**. Taking the above steps beforehand should make for a more productive, meaningful conference. Contact your student's counselor to make this request.

- This is the first year that all of your courses are credit-bearing and that every course you take is recorded on your transcript, including both your final exam grade and final average. Your transcript will list all of your high school courses and grades and will be sent to colleges when you apply in the fall of senior year. This means that it is very important that you work your hardest this year. If you find that you are struggling in your courses, seek out your teachers for extra help.
- In early January, the Junior High Counselors will conduct their 9<sup>th</sup> Grade Annual Preview presentation. This presentation, we will review how to access the Program of Studies on the CNS website, graduation requirements and how to prepare for their upcoming 9<sup>th</sup> grade annual review.
- Start using Naviance to log of all of the clubs, extra-curricular activities, and volunteering that you are involved in. Keeping track of this will assist you when you are applying to college senior year.

- Remember to keep your grades up as they count toward your final GPA for college.
- Please make sure to get involved in our clubs and activities! You can join most of them at any time of the year.
- Please connect with your school counselor at any time. We are here to help you navigate through high school whether it is related to career, college, courses, grades or personally related items. We are here to listen!

# rade 11

- PSAT results will be released in December for students who took it on Oct.16<sup>th</sup>. Students will receive an email from College Board to login to see their scores online.
- Register to take the ACT in April or June and the SAT in May or June. Students planning to attend a four-year college, should take both the SAT and the ACT with writing.
- Visit the Career Center to meet with college representatives, get information on job shadows and/or summer programs at colleges and research careers. There is also a list of part-time jobs available on the Career Center website.
- Sign up for the SAT Prep courses in the House 1 Counseling office starting January 3rd. See page 1 for details.

# rade 12

- Complete your common application online at commonapp.org by November 19th. Let your counselor know as soon as you complete any application. You must fill out a pink sheet in your counselor's office after you send in your application. Remember, it may take up to two weeks to process your application.
- Check the CNS Career Center website for scholarships and be sure to pay attention to the deadline dates. All scholarships will be online to make it easier for you to check them.
- FAFSA should be done online at www.fafsa.ed.gov as soon as possible.
- The CSS Profile financial aid form for private colleges is at their website. Check the site to see if you need to fill this out for colleges where you are applying.
