IMPORTANT ANNOUNCEMENT !

Recently we have experienced an increase in student drop-off and parking issues. You may have seen me

more present during morning bus arrivals.

While I understand the rush of everyone's morning schedules—please read over the following points and support us in maintaining the highest level of safety for all of our students, as well as the most efficient way for our busses to complete our morning drop-off.

- At the north entrance (the wide entrance closest to the front doors) there are two 'NO PARKING' signs. Please refrain from parking in these areas as it impacts visibility pulling in and out and places cars and students directly in the line of traffic as more than 10 busses pull in every morning.
- Do not use the area at the north entrance to complete a 'U-Turn'.
- When dropping off your child, accompany them to the front door. Do NOT send students by themselves across the front grass from the roadside—this puts them in the position of walking in front of and/or between moving busses either entering or backing up.
- We ask that parents park, and/or drop-off students in the south lot—which does have a 'turn around' at the end of the first row so that you can drop your child right at the end of the
