We're off to a great start in the library! Students in all grades have learned about teamwork, how to carefully treat our books, our library and other resources. **4th** graders created photographs demonstrating our library expectations. These will be posted in the hall near the computer lab along with our TEAM pictures. The **3rd** graders created some great posters that will be laminated and used throughout the library. **2nd** graders wrote post its to respond to one of two questions: How can you remember to bring

your books to the library when they are due? What is a special place to keep your library books so that you will know where they are? **1st** graders read *Maybe a Bear Ate It and A Perfectly Messed-Up Story in which books are not handled properly. Then we discussed proper book care. Finally,* **Kindergarteners** *learned about teamwork and how to be a team by watching the Peppa Pig Pancake episode.*

All students learned that being a good citizen of our library means returning our books on time so that someone else can read them. To that end, overdue notices will be printed and distributed each Tuesday afternoon. If your child owes a book or books, look for the notice in their take home folder. Please send in overdue books right away. If you believe, there has been a mistake, please write a note on the notice or call to let us know. We want to take care of any errors right away!



Finally, all students will be using our **fantastic online resources** during library and in class. These resources range from online encyclopedias, dictionaries, videos, maps, magazines, ebooks, and other specialized resources and students are not limited to using them just in school. Students can access these from home, too! The advantage of these resources over Google and the web is that the resources are **grade level appropriate** and offer many features such as read aloud, pronunciation, dictionaries, and translation. These resources are not free

but are paid for by the North Syracuse Central School District and the OCM BOCES School Library System for our students and staff.
