# NOTIFICATION REGARDING STUDENT WORK AND PHOTOS

During the school year, your child may have the opportunity to have their photo taken, video image and voice recorded and/or art and written work published in connection with a school district activity or program. Your child's photo (image), schoolwork and/or name may be published in local newspapers, posted (displayed) on the district's website or used by the requesting organization (local TV or print media) for programming, i.e., backup and their news stories. If you DO NOT want your child's picture, name or schoolwork to be used in newspaper articles, video and/or district publications including our district's website, please inform your school principal in writing.



### Who to Contact: A Guide for Families

#### Start with the source

Whenever possible, begin by reaching out to the person most directly involved. This is usually your child's:

- Club Advisor or Activity Leader (for extracurricular involvement)

These staff members know your child best and are often able to resolve most issues quickly.

#### Use ParentSquare to communicate

ParentSquare is our primary tool for home-school communication. It's the easiest and most reliable way to contact staff, receive important updates and stay informed. If you're not sure how to use it, reach out to your school's main office (see school directory on page 2) for support.

#### If more help is needed

If your concern isn't resolved after speaking with the teacher, coach or advisor, please take the next step by contacting:

- Building-Level Administrator (such as the assistant principal or principal)
- District-Level Director (for special education, curriculum, athletics, etc.)

Our goal is always to work together to support your child. By starting with the person closest to the situation and following the appropriate steps, we can collaborate more effectively and respectfully.

### Utilization Study: Planning a Brighter Future

The North Syracuse Central School District has launched an ambitious Utilization Study to take a thoughtful look at how we use our buildings, staff and resources to support student success, today and into the future.

Guided by the question, How can NSCSD best organize its facilities, staff and grade configurations to maximize academic achievement, emotional well-being and equity for all students?, this important effort comes at a time when the district is navigating declining enrollment, reduced state aid and future opportunities like the arrival of Micron.

To lead the way, a Utilization Committee made up of parents, students, staff and community members is meeting monthly through December 2025. Each meeting

includes a tour of a district building and thoughtful, solution-focused discussions led by national experts Deb Ayers, Jen Heckathorn, PhD and John Wisniewski, CDF—who recently helped Baldwinsville through a successful, communitysupported planning process.

Superintendent Ward is excited about this work and encourages families and residents to follow along as the study unfolds by clicking the green banner on the district homepage at nscsd.org.

Key findings and potential recommendations will be shared with the public following the committee's final meeting in December. Stay tuned for updates on this important journey toward long-term sustainability, smart growth and student-centered planning.

### **District Alerts**

When schools are closed because of weather conditions or other emergencies, announcements are sent on ParentSquare and posted on the district website.

Other emergency conditions, such as impending storms, may require students to be dismissed before regular school closing time. Early closing/dismissal announcements are also sent through ParentSquare and posted on the district website.

While emergency closings are also shared with local media, district communications are the first and best source of information.

#### Prepare now

- Update your contact information: Contact your student's school to request changes to your email address or phone number in SchoolTool (which syncs with ParentSquare).
- Transportation: Ensure arrangements are in place for early dismissal situations. Please inform your student's school.
- Community Alerts: Grandparents and others can sign up for emergency alerts on ParentSquare by going to www.nscsd.org/ alerts.

# STAY CONNECTED WITH PARENTSQUARE

The NSCSD uses ParentSquare for essential communications with families. Many important, student-specific messages are sent through the system. Parents should be able to see all their children in one account and receive important notifications.

- Automatic Accounts: Accounts are created based on email or cell phone information in SchoolTool, NSCSD's student data system. Updates in SchoolTool take 24 hours to sync with ParentSquare.
- Register: Visit parentsquare.com/signin and use the email or phone number listed in SchoolTool. For convenience, download the ParentSquare app for iOS or Android.
- Check Your Info: Click on your name > My Account in ParentSquare to verify your contact details. If changes are needed, please contact your child's school office to update SchoolTool.

### Code of Conduct

The Code of Conduct applies to all students, staff, parents/guardians, and visitors while on school property, at school events or taking part in school-related activities. The main goals are to create a safe, respectful and supportive learning environment; teach responsibility, respect and good citizenship and ensure fairness and consistency in how rules are enforced.

#### **Student Rights:**

Students have the right to:

- Learn in a safe environment.
- Be treated fairly and respectfully.
- Express themselves as long as it doesn't disrupt others or violate school rules.
- Be informed about rules and consequences.

#### **Student Responsibilities:**

Students are expected to:

- Come to school ready to learn.
- Show respect for others and school property.
- Follow directions from school staff.
- Follow all school rules, including behavior, attendance and dress code.
- Not bring dangerous or illegal items to school.

#### **General Rules:**

- No bullying, harassment or discrimination
- No violence, fighting or threats
- No drugs, alcohol, tobacco or vaping
- No weapons of any kind
- No cheating or dishonesty

Positive behavior is encouraged and supported.

#### **Disciplinary Actions (Consequences):**

If a student breaks the rules, consequences may include:

- A warning or meeting with staff
- Loss of privileges
- Detention (staying after school)
- Suspension (removal from school for a set time)
- Referral to counseling or outside support
- Possible police involvement for serious offenses

The school tries to be fair, considers each situation, and may offer support services to help students correct their behavior.

#### **Parent/Guardian Involvement:**

Parents are expected to:

- Stay informed about school rules.
- Help their children follow the rules.
- Communicate with the school when needed.

#### **Visitors:**

All visitors must check in at the main office and follow school rules while on campus.

### **Attendance Matters!**

Regular class attendance is one of the most important aspects of a student's educational program. The educational process requires continuity of instruction and active classroom participation. According to the Board of Education policy on comprehensive attendance, children who turn six years of age during the school year are required to attend school at the start of classes in September. Also, students who turn 16 during a school year continue to be subject to the compulsory education laws through the end of that school year. The North Syracuse Central School District Board of Education strongly believes that daily classroom attendance is an important aspect of a student's educational program.

While we want all our students and teachers in school as much as possible, we want to stress the importance of attending school only when feeling healthy.

Within the meaning of the education law, excused absences are for illness or injury, medical or dental appointments, family emergencies, death or religious holidays. Upon returning to school, students must present a written explanation relative to their absence, including the specific dates they were out, to their teacher or attendance office.

Chronic truancy problems are reported to Onondaga Family Court and the student may be adjudicated as a "Person in Need of Supervision" (PINS).











### **ASBESTOS MANAGEMENT PLAN (AHERA)**

The NSCSD has been inspected for building materials containing asbestos as required under the Asbestos Hazard Emergency Response Act (AHERA). Copies of the Management Plan and the three year re-inspection are available in the main office of each building.

AHERA requires the district to appoint a "Designated Person" for asbestos-related concerns. Matthew Erwin, Director of Facilities, has been appointed as the "Designated Person" for asbestos-related concerns in the North Syracuse Central School District.

### Parents Bill of Rights for Data Privacy and Security

It is the North Syracuse Central School District's responsibility to adopt appropriate administrative, technical and physical safeguards and controls to protect and maintain the confidentiality, integrity and availability of its data, data systems and information technology resources. #### SUPPLEMENTAL INFORMATION REGARDING THIRD PARTY CONTRACTORS

Any and all contracts between the North Syracuse Central School District and thirdparty contractors, under which a contractor will receive student data or principal or teacher data, shall include provisions requiring that the contractor maintain the confidentiality of shared student data or teacher or principal data in accordance with law, regulation and district policy. #### DATA PRIVACY AND PROTECTION

Education Law 2-D is a New York State law requiring school districts to take significant measures to secure and protect the personally identifiable information (PII) of students, classroom teachers, and building principals. The district provides annual training for all employees who have access to protected data. The district has published a complaint process accessible to students, parents/guardians, teachers and building principals and has developed procedures for reporting and notifying when a breach or unauthorized disclosure occurs. ### Digital device policy

The North Syracuse Central School District is preparing for the 2025–2026 school year with a new cell phone policy aimed at creating a more focused and distraction-free learning environment. The updated policy, which aligns with New York State Education Law Section 2803, restricts the use of internet-enabled personal electronic devices during the school day across all grade levels.

#### What Families Need to Know:

- Device Use Not Allowed During School Hours: Students may not use personal internetenabled devices at any time during the school day, including lunch, recess, hallways, and study periods.
- School-Issued Technology Still Permitted:
   Devices such as Chromebooks or tablets
   provided by the district for learning purposes
   are still allowed.

#### **Legal Exceptions:**

Students may use personal devices during the school day only in the following situations:

- For specific educational purposes, when authorized by staff
- For health-related needs
- In emergency situations
- For translation assistance
- If they are primary caregivers (with counselor approval)
- If required by an IEP or 504 Plan











### NEIGHBOR NOTIFICATION LAW/INTEGRATED PEST MANAGEMENT NOTICE TO PARENTS AND ELIGIBLE STUDENTS OF THE NORTH SYRACUSE CENTRAL SCHOOL DISTRICT

The NSCSD is required to provide notice to students, staff and persons in parental relationships about pesticide application. You may register to receive written notice 48 hours prior to any pesticide application by calling 315/218-2174 and leaving your name, complete address and phone number. You will be given notice by mail at home, or by interoffice mail if you work for the district, before these applications. We incorporate the practice of monitoring all pest populations at regular intervals to keep identified pests under control. No pesticides are used when alternate methods will work. Pesticides will be used in a prudent manner in accordance with recommended application procedures. The notice will state: "This notice is to inform you of a pending pesticide application to a school facility. You may wish to discuss with the designated school representative what precautions are being taken to protect your child from exposure to these pesticides. Further information about the product(s) being applied, including any warnings that appear on the label of the pesticide(s) that are pertinent to the protection of humans, animals, or the environment, can be obtained by calling the National Pesticide Telecommunications Network Information Line at 1-800-858-7378 or the New York State Department of Health Center for Environmental Health Information Line at 1-800-458-1158." ## **Information for Families Experiencing Temporary Housing (Homelessness)**

The NSCSD is committed to helping all students succeed, no matter their housing situation. If your family is temporarily without a permanent home, your child has special rights under the law to ensure they can continue their education without disruption.

Here's what you should know:

#### Who qualifies?

Your child has rights under this policy if you are:

- Staying with friends or family because you lost housing
- Living in a shelter, motel, car, campground or other temporary place
- In any situation where you don't have a fixed, regular and adequate place to sleep

#### Your child has the right to:

- Stay in the same school (even if you move out of the school district) if it's in their best interest
- Get free transportation to and from school
- Enroll and start school right away even if you don't have all the required documents (like proof of residency, immunization records, or school records)
- Receive the same services and programs as other students

#### How do I get help?

The district's Homeless Liaison can help you enroll your child, arrange transportation or answer questions about your rights.
