As the New Year is upon us, and the first semester of the 2016-2017 school year is coming to a close, it is a time to reflect and a time to focus.

The 2016-2017 school year kicked off with many initiatives and a great deal of change. Our elementary and middle school teachers have been very busy with the implementation of a new reading program. The goal for our school district is to make literacy accessible to all students by expanding teachers' knowledge and participation in balanced literacy instruction within the classroom at all levels.

In addition, this fall we launched a more inclusive model of service delivery for our students with special needs. Many of our classrooms have general education teachers, special education teachers and service providers working together in the classroom setting to meet the needs of all students.

Numerous groups of staff, students, parents and community members participated this fall in our Visioning Work to help answer the question: What will the educational environment look like in the North Syracuse Central School District if we truly honor our mission? Some key themes that have emerged include:

- Local businesses and community involvement in our schools,
- Honoring diversity, differentiation and student choice in response to learning styles,
- Redesigning collaborative instructional spaces to enhance learning,
- District wide expectations for student behavior, and
- Respectful communication among all.

This information will be used as we plan ahead for the future.

Speaking of planning ahead, we are in the planning stages of the renovation design for KWS Bear Road Elementary School. Thank you to the voters for giving us this opportunity to redesign collaborative instructional spaces to enhance learning!

Last winter we asked parents and community members to participate in an on-line survey to tell us how we are doing. The results of the survey, district-wide and by school, have been posted on our website. Once again, we will be conducting this survey for the purpose of getting comparison data. Please take the time to complete the survey between now and

February 28, 2017. Your opinion matters and this information is invaluable as we plan for the future.




The food service department is looking to hire substitute workers.

WANT TO CHANGE YOUR CONTACT SETTINGS?



The North Syracuse Central School District uses the SchoolMessenger InfoCenter to help parents/guardians and staff manage automated messages. YOU can now manage the way you receive phone calls, text messages and emails from the district.

Sign-up for the free online system by going to www.nscsd.org/NSCSDinfocenter and clicking the sign-up link at the top right of the screen. To use InfoCenter on your mobile device, download the free "SchoolMessenger InfoCenter" app by going to the App Store or Google Play on your mobile device.

Sign-up, using the email address you have on file with your child(ren)'s school and create a password. You will receive a confirmation email at the address you entered. Be sure to check your "junk" or "SPAM" folders for the email. If you are unable to complete this step because the system does not recognize the email address you entered, the district may have an incorrect email address on file for you. Please check with your child(ren)'s school to

make sure your email address is correct.

Once you receive your confirmation email and click on that link, you will be signed-up for InfoCenter and can log in with the password you created. Please be sure to keep your password secure and available for future reference.

Once you are signed into InfoCenter, you will have the option of changing the way that you receive messages in the preferences section. If you have not received text messages from the district in the past, simply text the word "YES" to 67587 to opt into the service. For details about the alert types that the district uses, visit their "Communications" website at www.nscsd.org/communications. The system cannot be used to CHANGE contact information such as incorrect phone numbers/email addresses. You must contact your child(ren)'s school to make those changes.

Please note: If multiple people (mom and dad) in the same household, listed the same home telephone number on their child(ren)'s student data form, BOTH people need to sign-up for InfoCenter and modify their call settings for the home phone number if they do not want to receive calls.



Fashion Goes Green at Cicero-North Syracuse High School

C-NS' Green Closet seeking formal attire donations for February fashion event!



Cicero-North Syracuse High School senior, Danielle Roach, has always been interested in music and theater and enjoys acting. So when she was cast in the school's production of "All Shook Up" last year, Danielle was thrilled. Danielle actually had the unique opportunity of playing both a male character and a female character. And fortunately, when it came time to outfit her male character, Danielle knew exactly

where to look: at her school's Green Closet.

The Green Closet is a small second-hand "boutique" on the third floor of the school. Danielle knew about the Green Closet from having volunteered her time to work there. Throughout her high school career, Danielle had been interested in pursuing a career in interior design and had taken classes about the subject at C-NS. Because of Danielle's interest and background in design, School Counselor Christine Alencewicz,

who maintains the Green Closet, sought the student's assistance to help design and organize the shop.

"I knew about Danielle's interest in design and wanted to tap into that to benefit the Green Closet and also to give Danielle the experience for her resume," Christine said. "She was so happy to help me. She came in several days over the summer to put the store together in a nice, pleasing way. That wasn't something I could do...it was her niche."

When Christine talks about the Green Closet, she proudly discusses the concept behind it; reduce, reuse and recycle. According to the 2015 fashion documentary, "The True Cost," the average American discards 82 pounds of textile waste each year, adding up to 11 million tons, just from the United States. For the most part, textiles aren't biodegradable, meaning they sit in landfills and release harmful gases into the air.

Several years ago, Christine approached the school's administration, armed with statistics about the massive increase in textile production and wanting to do something to help reduce the massive negative impact on the community. Christine brought the concept of a "store" that would accept donations of clean, gently used, unwanted, but in-style clothing and accessories, right at the school, from which students could take items free of charge and reuse them. The idea was approved, and the Green Closet began.

Christine manages donations given to the store and utilizes student assistance to help keep the store organized and looking good so that students wanting to find a new item, will be more inclined to visit the store and browse. "All items are free for the taking to anyone that just wants something new," Christine said. "We have students come in that may have spilled something on their shirt, broken a shoe or who just want a little pick-me-up because they're having a bad day. They're welcome to whatever they need or want."

This February 11, for the first time, the Green Closet will be hosting a prom dress event so that students can come in, try on and walk away with a new prom or ball dress absolutely free of charge. In the past, brand new dresses were donated by several local bridal shops for any students wanting or needing a prom dress. "Sometimes our students are asked to attend several different spring dances and don't want to buy a different dress for each event," Christine said. "The prom dress donations can give them an option of having a second dress at no additional cost. We're very thankful for any dress donations!" Additional details about the Green Closet's prom event will be made available on the district's website and at C-NS as the event is finalized.

Any local businesses or individuals wanting to donate dresses are asked to please contact Christine Alencewicz at C-NS by email at CAlencew@nscsd.org. Christine is hopeful that local companies will come out to help, saying, "We want this event to be fun for all our female and male students too. It would be amazing if we could offer a large selection of formal wear so that all our students have the opportunity to feel like a princess or prince for their prom or ball."
