Before I begin, I want to take a moment to thank all of you who voted in support of the North Syracuse Central School District during last month's budget vote and board member election. I am happy to report that the 2020-21 school budget has successfully passed. I know that the past few months have been difficult financially and emotionally and I

appreciate the support of the community...moreso in these challenging times.

Construction Underway at KWS Bear Road Elementary *District Urges Public to Use Caution and Avoid Closed Work Site*

The long-anticipated and much-needed construction is now well underway at one of the North Syracuse Central School District's oldest elementary school buildings — KWS Bear Road Elementary School thanks to tremendous community support and determination.

While much of the community was tucked away, staying safe at home this past spring, the voter-approved renovations quietly began at the six-plus decades old building.

The project has been a long time in the making, first seeking community support through a Capital Project Referendum in October of 2016. That vote was approved, but due to project costs being higher than planned, a second referendum was needed. That vote was also approved in December of 2019 and the project was set to begin this spring.

After sorting through some configuration concerns along with building closure due to COVID-19, construction was able to begin early. Now that the work is progressing, the District would like to advise the community to be cautious around the building and to avoid the area if possible.

NSCSD Director of Facilities, Matt Erwin, who is overseeing the project, wants to ensure that work progresses safely. Erwin, who has seen some curious onlookers exploring the construction site, cautions, "The construction site at Bear Road Elementary is closed to the public. Some people have continued to use the school's play areas and walkways but these areas are just not safe right now."

He added, "We want to remind people to pay attention to the physical barriers and warning signs that have been put up for their safety."

Construction fencing has been placed around the site where possible, but has been knocked down by pedestrians in some areas. The District is working to put up sturdier barriers and increase the number of signs directing people away from unsafe areas.

Additionally, for community members curious about the building progress, the District will be documenting the progress with pictures posted on the website and will provide updates at Board of Education meetings.

Mr. Erwin invites the community to visit the District's website at www.nscsd.org and check for project updates. "The changes are exciting for all of us and we want to share the building's transition with our community in a safe manner."

District Publications and Calendar

Tuesday, September 8 is the first day of school for the 2020-2021 school year. In late August, the printed school calendar will be mailed to homes of families with already registered school-aged children.

This year, because of the challenges of planning events during uncertain times, the District is stressing the importance of using the online calendar to verify events. SUMMER MEAL PROGRAM

Children in our community do not need to go hungry this summer. For many kids, summertime means food, friends and fun. For families who count on school breakfast and lunch, however, the summer months can be stressful and family food budgets have to be stretched even further. The US Department of Agriculture's (USDA) Summer Food Service Program helps fill the hunger gap.

FREE grab and go summer meals, funded by the USDA, are available to kids and teens ages 18 and younger at Roxboro Middle School (300 Bernard Street) in Mattydale, NY. This is an open site therefore free meals are available to all children ages 18 and under regardless of income.

The grab and go program takes place Monday through Thursday until August 13. Meal pickup (breakfast and lunch) is available from 8 a.m. - 10 a.m.

STUDENT REGISTRATION

The 2020-2021 school year begins Tuesday, September 8 and registration is underway! Whether your family is brand new to the North Syracuse Central School District or you have older children enrolled here, it is important to register any **new** students for the upcoming school year. Please be aware, even if you have a child previously registered for a preschool program, you are still required to register that child for kindergarten.

If your child has been attending school in NSCSD (other than a preschool program), there is NO ACTION REQUIRED. This pertains only to those children who have moved into the district or have reached the age requirement for kindergarten. Due to current regulations for physical distancing, the District is not open for in-person registrations. The District is currently accepting registrations only by mail or email.

Committee Exploring School Re-Entry Options



As planning for the upcoming school year amps-up, the North Syracuse Central School District (NSCSD) is actively exploring options for the safe reopening of schools. Earlier this spring, the NSCSD formed a Re-Entry Committee with more than 100 stakeholders coming together virtually to formulate a plan. In order to explore all options in depth and best support student learning, the Re-Entry Committee is divided into five sub groups: Instructional Operations Planning, Proactive Infection Planning, Social and Emotional Wellness, Workplace Safety and Communications.

Christopher R. Leahey, Ed.D., Associate Superintendent for Teaching & Learning, has been overseeing the committee's work and says he is grateful for their efforts. "Creating a comprehensive and flexible plan around the safe re-entry of all students and staff has been a tremendous undertaking. Because of these incredible volunteer leaders, teachers, parents and other staff, we have been able to break a monumental task into manageable pieces," Leahey said.

"The work they are doing, always considering critical guidance from federal, state and local experts, will serve as our roadmap as we navigate the academic, social, and emotional

effects of the COVID-19 pandemic on students and employees," he continued. "We are prioritizing the health and safety of all as we plan a safe opening in accordance with necessary guidelines."

District leaders are also collaborating with a regional reopening group led by OCM BOCES. All local school districts have been sharing information and ideas and brainstorming solutions. The regional group will meet throughout the summer.

As part of the NSCSD Re-Entry Committee's planning, the District will be administering a survey to families and staff. Regarding the survey, Dr. Leahey said, "Our groups are finalizing their survey questions and we're coordinating with the OCM BOCES regional group. We will be putting the survey link out to the public as soon as possible."

District leaders will have a tight time frame for analyzing survey feedback as they anticipate providing a draft plan to the Board of Education in early August. The draft will provide a tiered approach to reopening safely within all levels of spread and will incorporate the latest recommendations. With additional guidance expected from the CDC and state education and health departments, and with ongoing local meetings, NSCSD's draft will be modified as necessary in accordance with expert recommendations.

Dr. Leahey said, "The plan will be flexible and fluid as we continue to meet with neighboring districts and OCM BOCES and receive updated federal and state guidance. We are very fortunate to have so many great minds coming together to achieve a common goal. By planning and continuing to work together, we will ensure that our schools continue to provide safe and exceptional educational experiences for all students."

The North Syracuse Central School District will update families and staff with back to school information throughout the summer. Parents should check schooltool to ensure their contact information is up-to-date and staff should up date their information in WinCap Web. If parents need to update information in schooltool, they should contact the office staff at their child's school building.
