NYS DOT issues traffic alert for Cicero; closure will impact NSCSD students and families



Significant changes are coming to traffic patterns in the Cicero area. The New York State Department of Transportation (DOT) has announced that starting Monday, Feb. 24, South Bay Road will be closed to southbound traffic between East Pine Grove Road and the South Bay Road bridge. This closure, part of the ongoing I-81 Viaduct Project, is expected to last through October 2025 and will directly impact travel in the Cicero area—including routes to several of our schools.

The NSCSD Transportation Department has been working closely with the DOT to prepare for these changes. Bus routes have been adjusted to minimize delays, and families of students in the most affected areas have already been contacted. However, with the detours in place, some delays may still occur—especially for students traveling to and from Gillette Road Middle School, Cicero-North Syracuse High School and Cicero Elementary School.

"We know this will be an adjustment for everyone," said Superintendent Dr. Terry L. Ward. "Ensuring the safe and timely arrival of our students and staff is our top priority. We ask for cooperation and understanding as our transportation team works to minimize disruptions. Please allow extra travel time, follow detour signs and be mindful of increased traffic." The DOT has installed temporary traffic signals near the South Bay Road bridge and has published a detour map online to help drivers navigate the changes.

What You Can Do to Prepare:

- Plan ahead Expect delays, especially during morning drop-off and afternoon pick-up.
- Follow detour signs Stick to the recommended routes for a smoother drive.
- Be patient & courteous Everyone is in this together and a little kindness goes a long way!

Gillette Road Middle School's Tara Osier Named NYS Master Teacher



Tara Osier, a fifthgrade teacher at Gillette Road Middle School, was recently selected to join the prestigious New York State Master Teacher Program, a professional development and net-

working community celebrating the state's high-performing STEM teachers.

Tara is one of only 144 educators chosen from across the state and the first middle school teacher from the NSCSD to receive this honor. Her selection highlights her dedication to excellence in STEM education and her commitment to bringing innovative science instruction to her students. She first learned about the Master Teacher Program while attending a New York State Test Investigation Training at BOCES. Intrigued by the professional development opportunities, hands-on workshops and the chance to collaborate with other educators, she saw it as a way to share ideas and overcome challenges. "It's a great opportunity to work with other teachers in Central New York and throughout the state," she said.

Through the program, Tara hopes to expand her knowledge of science pedagogy, incorporate fresh activities into her classroom and help students explore STEM-related careers. "I hope to get them excited about STEM fields and career paths," she explained. With 25 years of teaching experience, Tara's passion for STEM education runs deep. She began her career at Cicero Elementary as a first-grade teacher, taught at Bear Road Elementary and Cicero Elementary in various grade levels, and transitioned to Gillette Road Middle School two and a half years ago. "I've always loved science and math. Today, I get to teach the subjects I loved and see the excitement in my students," she shared.

The rigorous selection process required Tara to meet strict eligibility criteria, secure multiple recommendations, pass a certification test and complete an interview and presentation before a panel. Her acceptance is a testament to her expertise and dedication to her craft.

Changes to Google Services for Students

The New York State Education Department has issued new guidelines requiring school districts, including NSCSD, to adjust student access to certain Google services.

What's Changing?

- No Changes to Core Services Students and teachers can continue using essential Google tools like Gmail, Classroom, Drive, Docs, Slides, Forms, Calendar and Sheets as usual.
- Changes to Additional Services Students will no longer have access to YouTube, Google Translate, Google Earth, Google Photos and other non-core services when logged into their district accounts.

How Will This Impact Students?

- No Direct Access Students won't be able to use YouTube, Translate, Earth or Photos through their school accounts.
- Teachers Can Still Share Videos Educators can embed YouTube videos in Google Classroom, Slides and approved learning platforms like EdPuzzle for students to view.
- Translation Support Available The district's ENL team has alternative translation tools built into some Google Core Apps to assist students who need them.
- Staff Access Remains Unchanged Teachers and staff will still have full access to Google's Additional Services

Why Is This Happening?

This update aligns with Ed Law 2-d, ensuring stronger student data privacy and security. While we understand these changes may affect some classroom activities, we are confident they won't disrupt learning. For more details, visit the RIC One Google Resource Hub on the district website.

Voters to elect three board of education members; petitions available

On May 20, 2025 NSCSD voters will choose three district residents to serve on the NSCSD Board of Education. Board members each serve a three-year term. The NSCSD Board of Education includes nine school district residents elected by voters. Board members are not financially compensated.

Residents must collect thirty seven (37) signatures from qualified school district voters to be placed on the ballot. Petitions must be filed by 5 p.m. April 21.

The board is the official policy-making body of the school district. It is responsible for carrying out the laws and regulations pertaining to the education of children living within the district. The board adopts district policy, curriculum, programs of study and approves the hiring of all personnel, as well as establishing the conditions of employment. The board is also responsible for maintaining district facilities, establishing an annual budget and setting a tax levy.

To qualify for board membership, an individual must be: a district resident for at least one year, a U.S. citizen, a minimum of 18 years of age and able to read and write.
