Students' interpretations breathe life into NSCSD Mission & Goals Superintendent's Student Council helps share common goals

On August 11, 2014, the North Syracuse Central School District Board of Education formally adopted a new mission statement and goals, which were developed with input from all district stakeholders working *together* to set a direction for the district.

Since that time, a great deal of work has been done to share the mission and goals with all students,

families, staff and community members. One of the greatest efforts being made to communicate these common objectives is being undertaken by students in the district.

As co-presidents of the district's Superintendent's Student Council, C-NS sophomores Sarah Wicks and Jerimiah Butler took it upon themselves to share the district mission and goals with their peers. The pair worked with the high school English Department to develop a writing assignment to prompt students to relate to the mission statement.

After compiling and reviewing the students' responses, Sarah and Jerimiah presented the collective thoughts.

They wrote, "Most of the responses revolved around central themes. Several students indicated that the significance of a mission statement is to set goals that [move people] forward." One student, Brandon McCarthy stated, "The statement is significant to [provide] guidance and direction that ensures everyone is doing their best."

Jerimiah shared his own response to the project individually. He stated, "One cannot actively pursue the goals without a set of guidelines to pave the way. Everyone with a set of guidelines has a reason for these guidelines; a purpose or significance. The significance of the North

Sarah and Jerimiah are happy about the work they are doing for the district. They said, "We are making exciting progress in the district. We are going to maintain a strong collaboration between the superintendent and the students to help make this district's future a very promising one."
