

Welcome to a new year! It's a great time to talk about goals and goal setting with your family. Parents keep in mind you are your child's hero and the most important people in their lives! They learn from you so try to start the new year with some good habits, turn off the TV and start a silent reading time for 15 - 20 minutes, play a family board game or start a puzzle together, or just get out and play in the snow, when we get it. Time moves so fast so be sure to cherish every moment you have.

Last month we had a lot of illness going around, we always encourage clean hands and keeping our fingers and other objects out of our mouths. Sometimes it helps to simply get the "worry" out of our heads. Please communicate with your child's teacher if you are suspecting absences due to anxiety.

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School physical examinations are scheduled for Tuesday, April 16th. If your child's physical exam paperwork has not been received, you will be notified that they are scheduled for a school physical exam. School physical exams will be completed by a Board Certified Provider and are free of charge.

Ensure your child is dressed appropriately for the weather. All students should wear a coat, hat, gloves and boots to school. Snowsuits are encouraged for outdoor play, pending the temperature is above 20° and at the discretion of the teacher.

We encourage all students to have spare clothing, in the event they need to change at school. This should include a shirt, pants, socks and underwear. The Health Office has a limited supply and a high need for clothing.

We are accepting donations of stretchy pants (used are acceptable) and new packaged underwear.

- 2. Play the exercise 3 times in a row <u>without mistakes.</u> (This means with correct notes and correct rhythms)
- 3. Listen to the sound you are making. It should be clear, no fuzzy or scratchy sounds
- 4. Say the note names and finger the notes as you say them.






2023 BOYS SHOOT OUT TEAM TAKES CHAMPIONSHIP TITLE!
