NSCSD Teams up With Other Local School Districts as C-NS Students Hope for Redemption in Friendly Pajamarama Competition



Beginning next week, students at Cicero-North Syracuse High School (C-NS), along with those from other schools in the North Syracuse Central School District, have been challenged to a friendly competition with other local high schools and districts. Hoping for redemption after their school's narrow defeat to Liverpool High School last year, C-NS students are encouraging participation in Paige's Pajamarama WEEK!

Paige's Pajamarama is a charity event allowing students to wear their (school appropriate) pajamas when making a donation to Paige's Butterfly Run, Inc., an organization which supports children with pediatric cancer at Upstate Golisano Children's Hospital. While Pajamarama is usually a day-long event, this year the cozy competition will last more than a week.

In 2019, C-NS students challenged Liverpool High School students to raise more money for Paige's Pajamarama by creating a challenge video, which went viral. While the 2019 challenge was initially only for the high schools, involvement grew and the event expanded to all schools in both districts. In the end, the schools and districts split victories with Liverpool High School earning the most money for the cause but the North Syracuse Central School District raising the greatest amount overall.

This year the North Syracuse and Liverpool school districts have reached out to the West Genesee and Fayetteville-Manlius districts to partner in the competition. ## **School Meal Pickup for Remote Students**


For families that may be unaware, the North Syracuse Central School District is providing meal pick up for students learning remotely. Families can pick up meals on Monday, Tuesday, Thursday and Friday from 4:30-5:45 p.m. at all secondary buildings. Meal pick up will also be available on Wednesday, November 18.

Meals can be picked up at all secondary buildings:

- Cicero-North Syracuse High School (6002 Route 31, Cicero) inside of the school at the main entrance by the flag pole (MOVED as of 11/2)
- North Syracuse Junior High School (5353 West Taft Rd., N. Syracuse) at the school's kitchen door in back of building
- Gillette Road Middle School (6150 South Bay Rd., Cicero) at the school's front door
- Roxboro Road Middle School (300 Bernard St., Mattydale) at the school's front door
