
At this past Monday's Board of Education meeting, we had the opportunity to <u>present our initial budget</u>. As you might imagine, trying to formulate a budget in the midst of such uncertainty is difficult. In order to continue providing quality instruction during the pandemic and beyond, it is imperative that school districts receive sufficient aid from the state and federal government. Earlier this week, we received an advocacy alert from the New York State School Boards Association, asking us to share the following actionable items with our community. Please help us advocate for adequate public education funding by taking a few minutes to complete the following links:

As infection rates decline and the state health department considers relaxing restrictions around COVID-19, the North Syracuse Central School District (NSCSD) is working to determine the feasibility of adding in-person instructional days for students. 


Because this school year has been so different, it has been challenging to get new photos for our District website at www.nscsd.org and other publications. So...we need your help!
