Hello North Syracuse Central School District Parents, Guardians, Teachers and Staff!

I'm happy to report that we have seen another week with declining COVID-19 positivity rates in Onondaga County. We move into the second week of February with cautious optimism about potentially increasing access to the normal "things" for our students. This past Monday, our Board of Education approved a plan to safely resume certain athletic activities and we are now able to allow extra-curricular activities that adhere to specific social distancing and safety guidelines. I want you to know that it is only because of the passion, dedication and commitment of our staff, students, parents, coaches and volunteers that we are able to open things up a bit. I can't tell you how many of you said things like, "If we just give the kids the chance to play/act/dance/work together, we will make it happen safely." You are devoted to our students and to giving them the opportunities they need and deserve. I sincerely thank you.

One of the things that I'm most excited about this week is an announcement I just made to our junior high and high school parents. After an ongoing and careful analysis, we are confident that we will be able to offer all hybrid students two days in school. Starting Monday, March 1, the North Syracuse Junior High School and Cicero-North Syracuse High School Monday and Tuesday cohorts and the Thursday and Friday cohorts will be combined so students attend two days/week.

As we increase the number of students in attendance, all social distancing guidelines and cleaning protocols will continue to be followed. We encourage our entire NSCSD family to continue following guidelines and get vaccinated when it possible. For those of you that may be planning to travel over the upcoming mid-winter break, please be sure to review the New York State Travel Guidance beforehand. If your student is required to quarantine after vacation, he/she will not be able to take part in hybrid learning and athletics/extra-curricular

## Kindergarten Registration for the 2020-2021 School Year



Each spring, elementary schools in the North Syracuse Central School District begin registering kindergarten students for the following school year. In order to adhere to COVID-19 protocol, schools will be accepting electronic registrations as well as scheduling in-person registration appointments. Elementary school staff are in the process of mailing letters to families that will be registering known new students. In order for your child to enter school next fall, he or she must be five (5) years old on or before December 1, 2021.

The following items are needed for registration: Parent identification, proof of birth, verification of your child's immunization record, proof of residency and custody papers, if applicable. Please note, the following documents are acceptable as proof of residency: mortgage statement, lease agreement, purchase offer and/or utility bill. A driver's license is NOT acceptable as proof of residency.
