District Chromebook Settings to be Updated on Monday, January 25

Beginning Monday, January 25, 2021 all District Chromebooks will be updated with new settings to ensure student accounts are secure.

Whenever a Chromebook is inactive for 5-10 minutes, or the lid is closed, the Chromebook will go into sleep mode, the screen will go dark and will lock. When the lid is opened or a key is tapped, the Chromebook will wake up and the user will need to enter the password to unlock the screen. The Chromebook will open to the exact state that it was when it locked so that the user can continue where they left off.

Students are strongly encouraged to log out of their Chromebooks at the end of every day and make sure they are logging into ClassLink daily for attendance purposes.
