Hello North Syracuse Central School District Parents, Guardians, Teachers and Staff!

Happy New Year and welcome back! As seems to be the case these days, we are dealing with something different than our expected return to school. We are experiencing increased positivity rates throughout the county and within our community. Out of an abundance of caution, the NSCSD made the decision to continue with fully remote instruction through next Friday, January 15. We are planning for students to return to the hybrid schedule on Tuesday, January 19.

Please remember that all students are using <u>Classlink</u> for attendance and should be logging in each day they are working remotely from home, including Wednesdays. Students with Chromebooks can log directly into Classlink using the welcome screen. Students using other devices should go to <u>nscsd.org</u> first and click on the Classlink Launchpad banner at the top of the webpage. This will ensure that a student's attendance for the day will be logged.

To ensure that all students have uninterrupted access to healthy meals, the District has expanded meal pick up options for families during the period of remote instruction. See the article below or <u>click here</u> to learn more.

Throughout the next several weeks we will be working with the Onondaga County Department of Health to coordinate dates for additional asymptomatic testing in our schools. We will communicate testing schedules with our families and staff as testing dates are determined.

Period of Remote Instruction

On January 2, the North Syracuse Central School District made the decision to have students participate in fully remote instruction through January 15 due to increasing COVID-19 positivity rates. In an effort to ensure that students have uninterrupted access to meals, the District is expanding their meal pick up options during the period of remote instruction.

The District is offering morning and evening meal pick up at select locations. Morning meal pick up (9 a.m. to noon) is available at both Roxboro Road Middle School (300 Bernard St., Mattydale) and Lakeshore Road Elementary School (7180 Lakeshore Rd., Cicero) every Monday through Friday. Evening meal pick up (4:30 p.m. to 5:45 p.m.) is available at all of the District's secondary school buildings, Cicero-North Syracuse High School (6002 Route 31, Cicero), North Syracuse Junior High School (5353 West Taft Rd., N. Syracuse), Gillette Road Middle School (6150 South Bay Rd., Cicero) and Roxboro Road Middle School (300 Bernard St., Mattydale) every Monday, Tuesday, Thursday and Friday. The expanded program will continue through January 15.
