North Syracuse Central School District Students, Staff, Parents and Guardians,

The North Syracuse Central School District is partnering with Onondaga County to offer an in-District vaccination clinic to eligible students, staff and families. The clinic will take place at Cicero-North Syracuse High School (6002 Route 31, Cicero, NY 13039) from 1 to 3 p.m. on **Monday**, **August 30**. **Vaccination is the leading health prevention strategy** and the NSCSD encourages all eligible individuals to consider receiving the COVID-19 vaccine after discussion with their primary care provider.

Eligible students (age 12 +) and their family members from schools other than C-NS can participate in the clinic as long as they have the <u>printed and signed consent form</u>, provide their own transportation and stay with their child during vaccination. The clinic is for students and families to receive their FIRST dose vaccination. The necessary second dose clinic will take place at C-NS on Monday, September 20 for anyone participating in this clinic.

If you are the parent/guardian of a child eligible to receive his/her FIRST dose vaccination, please <u>click here</u> to register your student. Be sure to select the clinic at C-NS on Friday, August 30.

- To receive a vaccine, your child must bring their printed, and signed consent form along with proof of identification (driver's license or school ID) to their appointment. - 2) Individuals receiving the vaccine must also fill out the required New York State Department of Health Vaccine Form online at: http://forms.ny.gov/s3/vaccine.

Any family members that also would like to receive a vaccine can schedule an appointment using the same link. The same forms must also be completed for each individual and presented at the time of the appointment. Registrants should arrive 5 minutes prior to their scheduled appointment time and enter the school at the main entrance.
