The North Syracuse Central School District is a 64-square mile district composed of villages and large residential areas in three townships. School census reports a population in excess of 65,000. Cicero is located 20 miles north of Syracuse in Central New York.

Cicero-North Syracuse High School is a three-year high school requiring 22 credits for graduation. Over 150 courses are offered, and summer school is available.

# Computation of Rank and Marking System

Final examination, either local or regents, constitutes one-fifth of the final average. Honors/AP marks are weighted 1.05/1.10 for ranking.
